Aims of Bachelor's Degree Programme in Sociology

The broad aims of Bachelor's degree programme in Sociology are:

The aim of bachelor's degree programme in Sociology is intended to provide:

- (i) Broad and balance knowledge in Sociology in addition to understanding of key Sociology concepts, principles, and theories.
- (ii) To provide knowledge and skill to the student thus enabling them to undertake further studies in Sociology in related areas or multidisciplinary areas that can be helpful for self-employment/entrepreneurship.
- (iii) To provide an environment that ensures cognitive development of students in a holistic manner. A complete dialogue about Sociology, Sociology and its significance is fostered in this framework, rather than mere theoretical aspects.

What is BA Sociology?

Bachelor of Arts or BA in Sociology is a 4 year undergraduate course that spreads across eight semesters. The course deals with the various aspects of the social world including the psychological nature of men and women and the barriers between the different social strata. In other words, we can say that Sociology is the systematic study of society, culture, and the relationship between various O social levels. It also explains relationship between various individuals, their experiences and their attitudes.

- Sociologists have the opportunity to work in NGOs, several welfare organizations, and work in nontraditional roles.
- BA sociology also provides excellent preparation for students planning to pursue professional, MA / MS, and / or PhD degrees in business, development studies, law, psychology, sociology, urban planning, and other social sciences.

Why Pursue BA Sociology?

- BA Sociology is the most preferred degree to pursue a career as sociologist, social worker, counselor as per recruiters.
- The employment opportunities for sociologists is predicted to increase by 4 % from 2019-2029 , as per US Bureau of Labor Statistics reports , which is fast as compared to many occupations .
- Sociologists earn up to INR 7 lakhs per year. Human resource manager is the highest paid job after BA sociology with an average salary of INR 8, 32,500 in India.


