Instruction to Question Setter

Semester Internal Examination (SIE 20+5=25 marks):

The Semester Internal Examination shall have two components. (a) One Semester Internal Assessment Written Test (SIA) of 20 Mark (b) Class Attendance Score (CAS) including the behaviour of the student towards teachers and other students of the College of 5.marks.

End Semester Examination (ESE 75 marks):

There will be two group of questions. Group A will contain three questions in which all are to be answered. Question No.1 will be very short answer type (not MCQ) consisting of five questions of 1 mark each. Question No.2 & 3 will be short answer type of 5 marks each.
