## Semester-3

### Major-3

#### Ancient and Medieval Western Political Thought

##### COURSE OBJECTIVE:

The objective of this course is to introduce the students with the basics of ancient political thought of India. The students need to be acquainted with the vast repository of ideas and institutions produced by ancient Indian philosophers on politics and management of statecraft. The student would recall that India is one of the most ancient and rich civilizations of the world. This course module will make them understand the ideas of some prominent ancient political thinkers of India in light of the key sources like Vedas, Mahabharat, Ramayan, Puranas and some of the texts written by some individual philosophers themselves.

##### LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- The student will come to know about the ideas of individual sages and philosophers on politics and functioning of government.
- They will be able to interlink the themes on the functioning of the Monarchy and its relationship with the people taking the cue from the ideas of individual thinkers.
- Students will be able to explain the trajectory of ideas on key political questions and institutions of ancient India.

## **Major-4**

### **Local Self Government**

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVE:**

The objective of this course is to introduce the students with the basics of grass roots democracy i.e. the panchayati raj system at the rural level and the urban self-government at the urban level. The primary course objective for local self-government studies is to train individuals for effective local administration and development, focusing on concepts like decentralized power, democratic participation, local economic and social justice planning, efficient service delivery, and fostering community involvement in local governance. Students learn to analyze governance models, such as Panchayats and municipalities, and develop skills for implementing development schemes and ensuring accountability.

#### **LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

- a. The student will come to know about the panchayati traditions in India and development of its working culture.
- b. They will be able to understand the intricacies of democracy at the grass roots level.
- c. Students will be able to relate the local self-government vis a vis the world's largest democracy.
- d. They will be able to explain the status and challenges before public participation in Local self Government.
- e. They will be able to analyze the impact of Women's quota on Panchayati Raj System.
- f. They will be able to explain the prospects and significance of Local autonomy of Local self government.

## Semester-4

### Major-5

#### Ancient Indian Political Thought (IKS)

##### COURSE OBJECTIVE:

The objective of this course is to introduce the students with the basics of Indian Knowledge System of India. The students need to be acquainted with the integration of traditional Indian wisdom with contemporary political thought. The student would decolonize the Indian mind and recall that India is one of the most ancient and rich civilizations of the world. This course module will make them understand the ideas of some prominent thinking of Indian Knowledge System in light of the key sources like Vedas, Mahabharat, Ramayan, Puranas and some of the texts written by some individual philosophers themselves.

##### LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- The student will shift away from purely western paradigms by generating interest in and reverence for India's unbroken traditions of Knowledge.
- They will be able to gain an overview of the political, administrative and governmental practices of ancient Indian statecraft, including leadership, law and diplomacy.
- They will be able to apply ancient principles like justice, equality and fraternity to current global challenges.
- They will be able to analyze political issues using Indian philosophical tools, understand ancient Indian statecraft and governance, and develop innovative solutions to societal problems by drawing from India's rich, unbroken knowledge traditions.
- Students will be able to look beyond traditional paradigms to generate path-breaking and non-traditional solutions for problems specific to the Indian and global context.

## Major-6 Colonialism and Nationalism in India

### Course Objective:

The purpose of this course is to help the students to understand historically the advent of colonialism in India and the emergence of the discourse of Nationalism as a response to it. The aim is to engage with theoretical explanations of colonialism and nationalism in India at the same time. Study the social political and institutional practices that included in that period gradually paving way towards independence and democracy in India.

### Learning Outcomes:

- a. At the end of the course students would show and understanding of the nature of colonial rule in India and the various developments through which its consolidated itself.
- b. They would come to demonstrate awareness of the specific impact of colonialism on Indian Economy.

### Major-8

#### Modern Western Political Thought

##### Course Objective:

The purpose of this module is to introduce to the students some modern political thinkers from the West who shaped the ideas and key concepts of political Science in the Anglo- American tradition. Developing a 'just society' and a 'just state' has been a perennial question for all civilizations. But the answers are not alike. They are different across civilizations and times. This course examines the ideas of some of the prominent modern political thinkers beginning from Machiavelli to T. H. Green. The seeds of the conceptual themes which seem to be so enriched today with sovereignty, social contract, General will, Utilitarianism and theory of state. The course seeks to trace that ideas and tradition and examine them critically.

##### Learning Outcomes:

- The students will know the key ideas of all the political philosophers given in the course.
- They will be able to make a distinction among Hobbes, Locke, and Rousseau on the state of nature, the law of nature, nature and form of contract and the emergence of state from the contract.
- They will be able to answer how and why Machiavelli gave an overriding priority to pragmatism above ethics and values in operation of statecraft.
- They will be able to discern the meaning of utilitarianism and how Bentham and Mill differed from each others.
- They will come to know about T. H. Green, his ideas concerning theory of state and his positive Liberalism.

## Major-13 Party System in India

### Course Objective:

This Course focuses on the study of political parties in India both at center and state levels. The study comprises of their organization, ideology and political support base. The in-depth understanding of parties would enable the students also to examine the questions of inner party democracy, transfer of power within the party and party manifesto. Further, it engages the students on the questions of government funding of elections and elections campaign in the country. With the application of new technologies and new mass media, it is important to understand how the nature and magnitude of elections campaigns have changed in India. The course allows the students to make a comparative study of elections manifestos of major political parties which will give them insight into their commitments to the issues and how and in what ways they converge as well as differ from each others.

### Learning outcomes:

### Major-19 Indian Foreign Policy

#### Course Objective:

One of the fastest growing economies in the world, India is confronted with a number of dynamic and complex issue-areas that call for multiple geopolitical, geo-economics and geostrategic engagements and alignments but not at the cost of one of the core principles of India's foreign policy, namely strategic autonomy. As the 'Asian Century' unfolds in all its spatial-geographical diversity and complexity, there is a growing appreciation of the fact that as her overall power profile improves, India cannot afford to remain 'silent' on matters of Regional and global importance, and will have to take positions even on issue-areas that hitherto appeared geographically remote and/or geopolitically irrelevant. India's maritime security in the Indian Ocean is increasingly undermined by transnational, non-traditional threats including piracy, smuggling, drug trading, human trafficking and illegal migrations, environmental degradation, trade disruption, weapons proliferation and terrorism. Indian foreign policy is playing a significant role as non alignment to Vishwa-Mitra, world peace and humanity. It is also playing a significant role in new frontiers such as the Polar Regions, Outer Space, and the Cyberspace.

#### Learning Outcomes:

- At the end of the course students would have acquired a comprehensive understanding of Indian foreign policy, major approaches to the study of Indian foreign policy.

## Semester 8

### Advance Major-2 Modern Indian Political Thought

- Students will be able to understand the concept of Social justice and contribution of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar to achieve social justice to make more egalitarian modern India.
- Students will come to understand and explain the Gandhian way of political thinking and his contribution and limitations, and well known social reforms of his heirs specially Vinoba Bhave.
